

LIFT WOMEN'S LIVES WITH SEWING MACHINES Women's Empowerment Project | Anglican Diocese of Kondoa

Improve women's lives by helping purchase sewing machines for the Sewing School offered by the Women's Empowerment Project in the Diocese of Kondoa, Tanzania, Africa. The Women's Empowerment Project was started in 2013 to lift the lives of women in Tanzania.

After they complete the sewing school, the women use their newly acquired skills to make merchandise and sell their products house to house, in local markets, and in small shops.

According to the Rev. Dr. Lilian Gaula, the project desperately needs 30 more sewing machines for its sewing school. Lilian is the

chair of the Mother's Union in Tanzania, which runs the Women's Empowerment Project. Lilian is also an Anglican priest, wife of the Rt. Rev. Given Gaula, who is Bishop of Kondoa, and mother of three. Lilian and Bishop Gaula visited St. John the Divine in April 2024.

Each machine costs approximately \$150.
