**The Rt. Reverend John Toga Wea Harmon**

Topic: “Rejoice in Hope”

The Rt. Reverend John Toga Wea Harmon became the 14 th bishop of Arkansas January 2024. He is the first Liberian-born diocesan bishop in the United States. Previously he was the rector of Trinity Church in Washington, DC. Bishop Harmon is the principal visionary and co-founder of the Episcopal Service Corps (ESC), a federation of young adult service programs across the Episcopal Church. He also founded the Trinity Development Corporation (TDC) to help empower the underserved to achieve self-sufficiency through counseling, education and improved access to adequate health care.



**Rosemary Rodgers**

Topic: “Bible Stories of Hope”

Rosemary Rodgers is a wife and mother and the handbell choir director at St. John's Episcopal Church, OKC. She has been a simulated patient, a renaissance fair pubber, and a teacher. She taught music, drama, religion and science.
