

The Anglican rosary was created in the 1980's by Lynn Bauman, an Episcopal priest in San Antonio, Texas. The Anglican Rosary is a combination of the Eastern Orthodox prayer rope and the Western Church's Rosary. Comprised of 33 beads, broken into 4 sets of seven smaller beads called week beads and divided by 4 larger beads called Cruciform beads. Beginning and ending with the cross you say a prayer on each bead. The difference between the Marion or traditional rosary and the Anglican Rosary is there are no set prayers for the Anglican rosary. Here are a few forms of prayer to get started with.

- I. Cross: In the Name of the Living God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
- Invitatory Bead: Open my lips O Lord and my mouth shall proclaim your praise.
- Cruciform Beads: Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit.
As it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever, Amen.
- The Week Beads: Holy god, Holy and Mighty, Holy Immortal One,
Have Mercy Upon Us (Me)
- Last Bead: Open my lips O Lord and my mouth shall proclaim your praise.
- Cross: In the Name of the Living God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
- II. Cross: Blessed be God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and Blessed be His Kingdom now and forever. Amen.
- Invitatory Bead: Collect for Purity: Almighty God, unto whom all hearts are open,
All desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid: Cleanse the Thoughts of our hearts, that we may perfectly love you and worthily magnify your Holy name. Amen
- Cruciform Beads: Agnus Dei: Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world,
Have Mercy on us.
